INOS, Governor of the 10 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands ("CNMI"), et al., 11 Defendants. 12 13 Pending before the court are several petitions for attorneys fees. On January 29, 2014, the 14 court held two teleconferences with counsel to discuss the status of their settlement negotiations 15 with regard to said petitions. The Government advised the court that it had reached settlements with 16 both Attorney Jorgensen and Attorney Woodruff but did not reach a settlement with the Bronster 17 Hoshibata firm or Attorney Lord. Accordingly, the court orders the following: 18 Bronster Hoshibata Petition for Attorneys Fees and Costs (ECF No. 492) and 19 **Supplemental Submission (ECF No. 572)** - The court will hold an evidentiary hearing on 20 the Bronster Hoshibata petition on Monday, February 3, 2014, at 8:30 a.m. Attorneys 21 Bronster, Hatch, Jorgensen and Woodruff are ordered to be present for said hearing, along 22 with counsel for the CNMI Government and court-appointed Trustee Joyce Tang. The court 23

will permit Mr. Lord to participate by telephone for this hearing.¹

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¹ In the event the CNMI Government and Bronster Hoshibata reach a settlement prior to the scheduled hearing, the court will vacate the February 3rd evidentiary hearing. The CNMI Government and Bronster Hoshibata shall thereafter file a stipulated motion to approve such a settlement, which will be scheduled for hearing on March 4, 2014, consistent with the schedule set forth below with regard to the stipulated motions to approve the settlements reached with Messrs. Jorgensen and Woodruff.

- **Lord's Amended Fifth Declaration in Support of Petition for Attorneys Fees and Costs** (ECF No. 602): On January 27, 2014, the CNMI Government filed an Opposition to the latest submissions of Mr. Lord. *See* ECF No. 604. Therein, the CNMI Government moved to strike Mr. Lord's amended submissions (ECF Nos. 598 and 602). The court hereby denies the motion to strike; however, the court will grant the CNMI's request for additional time to thoroughly review and respond to Mr. Lord's latest submission. Accordingly, the evidentiary hearing on Mr. Lord's request for attorneys fees and costs shall be held on March 4, 2014, at 9:00 a.m. Any objection or opposition to Mr. Lord's fee application shall be filed by February 19, 2014. Mr. Lord shall thereafter file a reply to any such objection or opposition no later than February 24, 2014.
- **CNMI Compliance and Trustee Report** Following the March 4th evidentiary hearing on Mr. Lord's fee request, the CNMI Government shall report on its compliance with the terms of the Settlement Agreement, and the appointed Trustee, Civille & Tang, PLLC, acting by and through its principal representative Joyce C.H. Tang, shall present an update on the status of the Settlement Fund. Ms. Tang shall file a written report no later than February 11, 2014. Comments to the Trustee's report shall be filed no later than February 19, 2014. Ms. Tang may respond to any such comments by February 24, 2014.
- **Stipulated Motions to Approve Settlement of Jorgensen and Woodruff's Fee Applications** The Government and Attorneys Jorgensen and Woodruff shall file stipulated motions to approve the settlements reached with said counsel no later than January 31, 2014. Oppositions/objections to the stipulated motions to approve shall be filed by February 19, 2014. Replies to such oppositions/objections shall be filed no later than February 24, 2014. The court will hold a hearing on the stipulated motions to approve on March 4, 2014, immediately following the presentation of the Trustee's report. IT IS SO ORDERED.
